- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: 1 Timothy 3:16.
 - B. Paul was a man who was deeply concerned with the fundamentals.
 - C. The basic task is to guard God's revelation. (John 17:14, Acts 4:31, 12:23, 19:20, 2 Corinthians 2:17, 4:2)
 - D. The heart of the message is the message of Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 1:23, 2:2, 2 Corinthians , 4:5, Galatians 6, Philippians 1)
- II. Everyone agrees on this in the church--great is the mystery of godliness. Christ is the mystery of godliness. (Acts 19:28)
- III. Statements about the faith.
 - A. God became man. He pre-existed but was not visible. (1 Timothy 1:17, 6:16, Colossians 1, Hebrews 1, 9:26, John 17, Galatians 4:4, John 1:1, 1:14, Romans 1:3, Philippians 2, Hebrews 2:14)
 - B. Jesus was justified in the Spirit. He was declared to be righteous regarding his human nature. (Matthew 3:15, 1 John 2:1, Hebrews 4:15, 5:9, 7:26, 9:14, 2 Corinthians 5:21, 1 Peter 2:21)
 - 1. He was also declared righteous by the Spirit. (Romans 1:3)
 - 2. Jesus did not sin and could not sin because of his divine nature.
 - C. Jesus was seen by angels.(Luke 22;43)
 - 1. Jesus triumphed over the demonic on the cross. He preached to them in prison. (Colossians 2:14)
 - 2. Jesus was also seen by good angels who attended the resurrection. (Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, John 20)
 - D. Jesus was preached among the nations. Jesus demanded that his name and work be preached.
 - E. Jesus was believed on in the world. (Acts 2:42)
 - F. Jesus was received into glory. This means that God was pleased with the work of Christ. (Acts 1:9, Hebrews 1, Philippians 2:8)
