A Solemn Call to Spiritual Duty John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: 1 Timothy 6:13-16.
- B. Paul wants to motivate Timothy to adhere to his commission.
- C. Motivation in ministry is related to the nature of our God. The way we live our lives is a direct result of who we understand our God to be.
- D. Certain attributes of God give us courage in our spiritual duty.
- II. The preserving power of God.
 - A. He is the creator of life.
 - B. He sustains all life. (Psalm 36:6)
 - C. He is the protector of his own. (Psalm 37:28, Matthew 10:21)
 - D. Paul commended Jesus to Timothy as a model. Jesus trusted God for the resurrection so he never equivocated. Our courage depends upon a belief that certain power comes from God.
- III. The truthfulness or trustworthiness of God.
 - A. The glorification of the children of God will one day come. (1 John 3)
 - B. God has an incredible future in store for us.
 - C. God in his own time will reveal Christ.
 - D. The man of God fulfills his spiritual duty because of his confidence in God.
- IV. The blessedness of God—he is content, satisfied and has no frustration over anything.
 - A. Nothing is beyond his control so he is totally content. (Psalm 2:12)
 - B. God is working all things together for our good, so we too can be content. (Romans 8:28)
- V. The sovereignty of God.
 - A. No one beside him is God. (Isaiah 40:25; 44:6)
 - B. God has absolute power. (Deuteronomy 4:35, 39)
 - C. The fact that God is sovereign takes away every anxiety of our lives. (Deuteronomy 10:17, Psalm 136:3, Daniel 2:47)
 - D. We can be comforted that God is in charge.

VI. The eternality of God. We have a God that will always be there to fill all our needs. (Psalm 36, Isaiah 28, Psalm 90)

VII. The holiness of God. (Psalm 104:2, Exodus 32:34, Exodus 15:11, 1 Samuel 2, Matthew 5:8, 1 Corinthians 13:12, 1 John 3)

- A. God is so holy he never makes mistakes.(John 17, Isaiah 3:14)
- B. Because he is holy he will chasten sin.

VIII. We do not need to fear what man will do to us because we know who our God is.
