I. Introduction.

- A. Text: 2 Timothy 4:1-5.
- B. The presupposition is that Timothy was to obey the commands given because he was called by God to the preaching and teaching of the word.
- C. Because we have been called to salvation, we all have a unique call to share that calling with others. (Revelation 22:17, 1 Peter 2:9, Ephesians 4:1)
- D. There is a specific call to the direct ministry of the word. (1 Timothy 1:12, 2 Timothy 1:10)
- E. One can know that he is called specifically.

II. Subjectively.

- A. This is a craving--a compulsion. (1 Corinthians 9:16-17)
- B. This is not ambition. (3 John 7)
- C. Timothy was compelled in this way. (2 Corinthians 1:1, Philippians 2)
- III. Objectively. This takes into account circumstances, talents and gifts.

IV. Collectively.

- A. The church must step in to affirm a calling.
 - 1. Sin can keep a person from serving effectively.
 - 2. The church must affirm one's suitability.
- B. The church also must receive. The body is always in need of suitable ministers.
- C. Timothy fit the criterion.
- V. Effectivity. (Jeremiah 23, 1 Thessalonians 2, 1 Corinthians 16:10)
- VI. The expectation of leaders.
 - A. Leaders must be willing to suffer. (2 Timothy 3:1, Hebrews 13:23)
 - B. The measure of a man's character is his unwillingness to compromise.

VII. The Extent.

A. Timothy was to do the work of an evangelist. (Ephesians 4:11)

	B. We must be faithful to preach the gospel.
	1. Be simple and clear.
	2. Know your limits.
	3. Do not manipulate. The will, not the emotions must be manipulated. (Ephesians 2:1)
