- I. Introduction.

 - B. Part of spiritual leadership is silencing those who should not speak.
 - C. God will silence the wicked. (Psalm 63:11, 107:42, Ezekiel 16:63, Romans 3:19, Proverbs 10:31, 12:19, Ezekiel 3:26-27)
- II. There are ways we can silence certain people.
 - A. We can revoke their right to speak. This is to take away a privilege of teaching. (1 Timothy 4:1, 6:20, 2 Timothy 3:13)
 - B. We can overpower with the truth. (Matthew 22:34)
 - C. We can silence by holy living. (1 Peter 2:15)
- III. The description of these men.
 - A. There are many people who must be silenced. (1 Timothy 4, 2 Peter 2)
 - B. They are rebellious. The church cannot control them, and they do not submit to spiritual leaders or the Scripture.
 - C. They are persuasive but have nothing to say.
 - D. They are deceivers. There will always be people who want their ears tickled. (2 Timothy 4, Galatians 2:7-12)
 - E. They profess to have special knowledge of God.
 - F. False teachers take advantage of the weak. (2 Timothy 3:6, 2:14, 2 Peter 3:16)
 - G. They are the opposite of God's chosen leaders.
