 - D. They were guilty of mocking the truth of God.
 - E. They were not reacted to with kind words. They were called lying vicious gluttons.
- III. The reaction to these men.
 - A. They were to be reproved with the goal of correcting them.
 - 1. They were to be rebuked severely.
 - 2. They were to be cut off by taking away their platform, confronting with truth and demonstrating with a holy lifestyle.
 - B. They were to turn away from their teaching.
 - 1. False teachers were teaching false mysticism.
 - 2. Other teachers were teaching a form of legalism.
 - 3. There is no benefit to this. (Jeremiah 23:32)
- IV. The evaluation of these men.
 - A. They taught sacramental religion, but Jesus taught that purity comes from the inside.
 - B. Their deeds reveal that they do not really know God personally. (2 Timothy 3:5)
