Dead Faith, Part 1 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: James 2:14-26.
- B. Faith, if it has not works, is dead.
- C. Many people possess nothing more than a dead faith.
- II. Dead faith is a form of non-saving belief.

A. It is religion without reality.

B. There is a non-saving faith that works--this is legalism. However, the concern of James is an absence of any evidence of transformation.

C. The presence of external good works does not necessarily indicate that one is a believer, but the absence of good works indicates that someone is not a believer.

III. Many people believe the right ideas but are not saved.

A. If you stay long enough in a ministry, you will find out where the true faith is really at.

B. James came giving a system of grace, but the people erred in thinking that all they had to do was believe.

C. We must run to Christ not simply as a liberty from legalism. True belief is accompanied by the fruit of righteousness.
