Fear of the Wrath to Come John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Revelation 6:12-17.
- B. In John's vision is the Great Tribulation to come.
- C. The force depicted here is fear.

II. Fear is a powerful emotion.

- A. It takes control of the mind.
- B. It results in all sorts of bad responses.
- C. People are not afraid of what they ought to be though—they ought to be afraid of God's judgment. (Hebrews 10:31, Luke 12:5)
- D. A day is coming when people will die of fear. (Luke 21:26)

III. The reason for fear.

- A. The world is filled with disaster because of the Great Tribulation.
- B. Despite the increasing disaster, the world will follow the Antichrist and persecute the saints. (Revelation 13:5, Matthew 24, I Thessalonians 5:3)
- C. The pattern of this great judgment is consistent throughout the Bible. (Matthew 24, Luke 21:25, Joel 2:10, Isaiah 29:6)

IV. The range of fear.

- A. A single massive earthquake. (Matthew 24:7; 8; Joel 2; Haggai 2:6-7)
- B. Sin will be unrestrained. (II Thessalonians 2, Revelation 7:9)
- C. The sun will go black. (Isaiah 13:9)
- D. The moon becomes like blood.
- E. Stars fall to the earth. (Zechariah 14:6)
- F. The sky is split apart and rolled up like a scroll. The whole universe will come down.

- G. The unstable crust of the earth will shift.
- H. The whole universe will be destroyed. (II Peter 2:3, Luke 21:11)
- V. The response of fear.
 - A. Sinners are accumulating the wrath of God, but believers do not need to be afraid because they have changed their destiny from wrath to blessing. (Romans 2:5)
 - B. Everyone ought to put his or her faith in Him.

3. How should texts like this serve as motivation to reach out to nonbelievers? Explain.
