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- I. Introduction.
 - A Text: Romans 12:1,1.
 - B. God looks for our cooperation even though he has absolute authority.
- II. Requests.
 - A. Present your bodies.
 - 1. This means presenting your whole self.
 - 2. God will dissolve the unrefinable aspects and use the refinable aspects of you.
 - 3. It is more difficult to be a living sacrifice than a martyr. Beware of being so heavenly minded that you are no earthly use.
 - 4. We are to be "holy" sacrifices. This means to be whole.
 - B. Don't conform to the world.
 - 1. We must deny the lust of the eyes, the lust of the flesh and the pride of life.
 - 2. Worldliness demands its own rights.
 - C. Be transformed by the renewing of your mind.
 - 1. Your mind takes on another form.
 - 2. An intake of truth begins to occur when the mind is reoriented.
- III. Reasons.
 - A. Therefore.
 - 1. God is our source.
 - 2. God is our course.
 - 3. We live through Him.
 - B. Mercies of God.
 - C. Service to God.
- IV. Results. Experiential proof that God's will is perfect, good and acceptable.
