- I. Introduction.
 - A. The Christian life is an integration. (John 15:4-5; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 11)
 - B. There are practical means for abiding in Christ.
- II. The hub: Christ.
 - A. A hub is a point of power.
 - 1. Jesus is the source of our power.
 - 2. We cannot live our lives in our own strength. (2 Corinthians 12:9; Zechariah 4:6; Philippians 4:13)
 - B. A hub must be at the absolute center of the wheel in order for it to function.
 - 1. Basically in our lives we want Christ to be Lord.
 - 2. The Lordship of Christ must be lived out day by day though obedience. (Luke 6:46; 1 John 3:24)

III. The spokes.

- A. The Word of God. The Bible is God's means of communicating to us. (Hebrews 1; 2 Timothy 3:16; 1 Peter 1:21)
 - 1. God has given us all that we need to live a godly life through the knowledge of Jesus and his precious promises contained in the Bible. (2 Peter 1:3-4; Psalm 119:18)
 - 2. Faith is nourished by the Word of God. (Romans 10:17; 2 Timothy 3:16-17)
- B. Prayer.
 - 1. As we find promises in Scripture, we are to take them back to God. (Hebrews 4:15-16)
 - 2. There is a connection to the greater works God promises and asking. (John 14:12-14)
- C. Fellowship.
 - 1. One purpose of fellowship is to lift each other up. (Hebrews 10:24-25; Ecclesiastes 4:9-10)
 - 2. Aspects of fellowship.
 - a. Sharing the Word of God. (Malachi 3:16; Deuteronomy 6:6)
 - b. Prayer. (Matthew 18:19-20)

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- 1. This is a matter of obedience. (Matthew 28)
- 2. The Great Commission is a matter of making disciples.
 - a. We start with sharing the gospel.
 - b. We then share with them the means for growth.
- 3. The greatest privilege of the Christian life is to be a witness to Jesus' power. (Acts 1:8)
