 - B. Hate means to relinquish control. (John 6)
- IV. Service is a prerequisite of honor. (John 12:26)
 - A. We are to follow Jesus who serves. (Acts 10:38, John 12:33)
 - B. Be involved with people.
- V. Faith is the prerequisite of light.
 - A. Commitment precedes knowledge. (John 7:17)
 - B. God is looking for a man of faith.
 - C. The world sees before he believes; Jesus says believing is seeing. (John 6:30; 11:40)
