Vision for Disciple Makers Skip Gray

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Jesus did not accidentally stumble across the finish line of life. (John 4; 17:4; 19)
 - B. Jesus' work was to redeem men and to train twelve. We have been sent to train others also. (John 20)
 - C. Text: I Corinthians 3.
- II. Considering that Jesus Christ is the foundation, we choose the building materials and God decides on the fire.
 - A. The precious materials are good things in life.
 - B. We must take care to build good things into the lives for others.
- III. God sends the fire to test the building materials.
 - A. Christ will not burn—He will always pass through the fire.
 - B. We must be disciplined in the basics—prayer, Bible study, etc—so that we will stand when the fire comes.
 - C. Depression, crisis, illness, rejection, death—these are the fires that will come.
 - D. When these things come upon others, we must not be too quick to intervene and play junior Holy Spirit.
- IV. Curriculum for disciple makers. (II Timothy 3:10)
 - A. Doctrine.
 - 1. We must teach others.
 - 2. We teach by modeling.
 - B. Lifestyle.
 - 1. This requires a high degree of vulnerability and approachability.
 - 2. Lifestyle and doctrine are inseparable.
