  - A. Text: Ephesians 6:10.
  - B. There is war in heaven with Satan and the angels. (Isaiah 14:12-14)
- II. Satan has five tools to attack us today.
  - A. Doubt. (Genesis 3:1, Matthew 4:3)
  - B. The deadening effect of sin. (Judges 16:1-20; John 12:6; 13:27)
    - 1. Sin destroys one's sensitivity to God.
    - 2. We will either be ruthless with sin or it will be ruthless with us.
  - C. Diversion. (Nehemiah 6:1)
    - 1. The great problem facing us today is mediocrity.
    - 2. We do too many good things that keep us from essential things like time with Christ.
  - D. Division. (Genesis 3:12; I Corinthians 3:3; Acts 15:25, 39)
  - E. Discouragement. (I Kings 19)
    - 1. God is a God of hope. (Romans 15:13)
    - 2. The spies discouraged the people of God. (Numbers 13:26)
- III. Our response to Satan's attack: the armor.
  - A. Truth. If you have a clear conscience, you do not need a good memory. (Acts 24:16)
  - B. The breastplate of righteousness. If we ask what the right thing to do is, this will help us.
  - C. Feet covered with the gospel. There is a tremendous benefit outwardly identifying with Christ.
  - D. The shield of faith. David relied on the promises of God. (I Samuel 17)

F. The sword of the Spirit. When we are attacked, we quote the Bible. (Ezekiel 2:4)
