E. Jesus was sensitive to the voice of God. We can hide ourselves in busyness from the voice of God. (1 Samuel 3:10, Genesis 3:8, Isaiah 66:1-2)

F. We are to be whole-hearted. We are often half-hearted in Scripture memory, Bible study or witnessing. (2 Chronicles 31:21; Psalm 119:9, 11; 1 Chronicles 16:9; Colossians 3:23)

III. Negative characteristics.

A. Pride. We are self-conscious, resulting in pride. (Proverbs 13:10)

B. Pride results in bitterness and wrath. (Hebrews 12:14-15, Mark 10:13, Luke 9:49-50)

C. Covetousness. The Lordship of Jesus Christ determines our attitudes. (Luke 12:15, Philippians 3, Matthew 10:39, Luke 14:33, Ephesians 4:29, Mark 10:21, 2 Timothy 2:3-4)

D. Entitlements.

B. A willingness to pay any price. (Philippians 3, Luke 16:3, Isaiah 6)

C. Teach-ability. (Mark 4:19; 7:13)
