Psalm 106:13-15 Skip Gray

I. Introduction.

- A. What happened to Israel as a nation was for our benefit. (I Corinthians 10:1-11)
- B. Text: Psalm 106:13-15.
- II. What the people did: In the wilderness, they soon forgot God's word.
 - A. God saved and redeemed the Israelites, but they forgot.
 - 1. We are joint heirs with Christ.
 - 2. We easily forget what God has done for us.
 - 3. God has not exhausted His resources.
 - 4. God only has to do something once to make it worth remembering.
 - B. The people were impatient and leaned on their own understanding. (II Timothy 3:10)
 - 1. If we do not have to know something, we should surrender it to God.
 - 2. We must run with patience.
 - 3. There are more red lights than green lights in the Bible.
 - C. The people lusted in the wilderness. (Numbers 11:4-6)

III. What God did.

- A. The people began to criticize Moses, and God smote the people. Every time we complain against Christian leadership, we test God.
- B. The people wanted flesh and they got it. They received a leanness of soul.

IV. Application.

- A. Make a covenant with God to wait on a decision if there is no clear guidance.
- B. Do not test God with any attitude of discontent or envy.
