 - 1. The people of God remembered the wrong thing.
 - 2. The basic problem is unbelief. (Psalm 78:17-22)
 - 3. Evidence of unbelief is complaining.
 - 4. We reflect the same attitude when we suffer from nostalgia and comparing ourselves to others.
