- I. Book recommendations.
 - A. Baxter's *Explore the Books*.
 - 1. Gives you a good overview of synthesis.
 - B. Jensen's The Bible Self Study Series.
 - 1. Not so much the product of synthesis as the process.
 - 2. It will get you into the book yourself.
 - C. Morgan's *The Analyzed Bible* and *Living Messages of the Books of the Bible*.
 - D. Scroggy Know your Bible and the Unfolding Drama of Redemption.
- II. Another look at Jonah.
 - A. Note the conjunctions with which each paragraph begins.
 - B. In summarizing a paragraph, try to limit the words of your title.
 - C. Sections.
 - 1. First paragraph: Calling, Commission, etc.
 - 2. Second paragraph: Conflict, God exposes Jonah, Discover, etc.
 - a. Do not try to force the alliteration in titles, but use it if you have it.
 - b. You want to gear your message toward the audience.
 - 3. Prayer of Jonah.
 - a. Look for the connectives: then, yet, but.
 - b. Look for the change in pronoun: I, thou, and a combination.
 - 1) Why?
 - a) Begins with confession.
 - b) Ends with promise.
 - 4. Chapter 3 paragraphs.

- a. First: Re-commission, First Cry, etc.
- b. Second: Crusade, Dual Repentance, Second Cry, etc.
- 5. Chapter 4 paragraphs.
 - a. First: Preacher Pal, Turning in the Prophet's Badge, the First Heart Revealed, etc.
 - b. Second: Love Lesson Taught, the Second Heart Revealed, etc.
 - 1) Greatest difficulty of the ministry is depression.
 - a) Every major servant of God goes through strong areas of depression.
 - b) It is easy to see how God deals with depression on the part of His servants.
 - 2) Jonah would not make a good Christian novel it ends unhappily.
- D. The process is as important as the product.

 - A. Take the plot of a book and map it out visually.
 - B. Put summaries at the bottom tracing the topics throughout the book.
 - C. Make it memorable; make sure it is an overview.
 - D. This distills your study down so it is accessible and memorable.
