- I. Introduction.
- II. Pessimistic attitudes are habits. The further we go in, the harder it is to break. It is also sin. Decide people are no good. (Philippians 4:8; Proverbs 15:15, 30; Romans 8:28; Jeremiah 17:5; Job 15:15; Leviticus 20:13; Romans 1:27)
- III. Overcome a fear of witnessing rooted in intellectualism by trusting in the gospel as the power of God for salvation. (Romans 1:16)
- IV. Communicate acceptance to unwed mothers. The blood of Christ cleanses us from all sin.
- V. On failure.
 - A. Do not fear your failures.
 - B. Keep moving. God will make us walk in dignity. (Leviticus 26:13)
 - C. Keep confessing. (Hebrews 2:9; Psalm 34:5)
- VI. Submit to authorities. (Romans 13:1-2)
- VII. Hate sin by learning to recognize where it leads: destruction. Learn that God wants you to obey because he loves you. (Genesis 4:7; Romans 8:32)
- VIII. God wants to guide us, so it is right to ask him for it.
- IX. The only basis we have for finding out problems in others is knowing that we have their heart and they love us. (Proverbs 28:23; Leviticus 19:17; Ezekiel 3:20)
- X. If a person does not turn you on, do not marry him or her. Get to know that person. (Luke 2:52)
- XI. Get to know a person spiritually subtly. Ask general questions.
- XII. Christians make decisions on social issues by voting their conscience.
- XIII. To believe in the name of Jesus means to believe in his person, character and attributes.
- XIX. There are some things God will not do for us, such as repent. We need to make the choice of God to experience his strength.
- XX. Explain the power of the Scriptures through personal testimony and do not worry about defending the Scriptures. (2 Timothy 3:17)
- XXI. Jesus would probably not carry a gun. There is a Scriptural basis for killing. (Exodus 20-21; Leviticus 21-22; 1 Samuel 14-15; Malachi 3:6; Colossians 2:9)

XXII. There is no place in Scripture that gives license for people to break the law in the name of peace. (Romans 13:1-2; 1 Peter 3).
XXIII. The weight of the Scripture teaches eternal security. This is not license to sin. (Hebrews 6; 10; Jude 4)
XXIX. Temptation is no sin. (Hebrews 4:15)
XXX. Know that Jesus bought you to conquer self-condemnation.
XXXI. False positive-ness is dangerous.
