  - A. People get mad at God because he does not answer their prayers. (Hebrews 6:15)
  - B. People get mad at God because he does not answer their prayers quickly. (Hebrews 10:36)
  - C. People get mad at God because they are trying to trade with God. (Isaiah 58:1-3; Romans 4:4-5)
  - D. People get mad at other people. (Jeremiah 17:5)
  - E. People get disappointed with themselves. There are no shortcuts to spiritual growth such as tongues. (Job 15:15; 1 Corinthians 1:7; 3; Galatians 5:22-23; 1 Corinthians 12:6)

F. Family problems. This can happen when people are playing the wrong roles. (1 Samuel 2:29; 3:12-13; Proverbs 22:6, 15; 23:4-5)
G. Tragedy or suffering. Suffering comes from self mostly because of sin. It comes from the world we live in. It comes for sanctification and humility. (Hebrews 11:13; 1 Peter 2:11;

Philippians 3:20; 2 Corinthians 7:10; Romans 5:3; 2 Corinthians 12:7; 1:8-9)

- H. Rebellion against authority. (Psalm 75:6-7)
- I. Playing to the wrong audiences. (John 5:44)
- J. Unfair supervision.
- K. Wandering desire. (Job 31:1; Matthew 6:22)
- L. Marrying the wrong person.
- M. Laziness. (Hebrews 6:12)
- N. Hyper-activity. (Mark 6:31; Isaiah 28:16; Proverbs 21:5; 19:2)
- O. Difficult situations. (Daniel 7:25; Psalm 71:9, 18)
- P. Poverty or prosperity. (Proverbs 30:8-9)
- Q. Negative association. (1 Corinthians 15:33; Proverbs 13:20)
