 - A. We get to heaven only by grace.
 - B. Salvation is only God's glory.
- III. A willingness to pay any price Christ asks us to pay.
 - A. We want to prove ourselves genuine ministers of God.
 - B. Character is our only defense.
 - C. We will never be in the will of God tomorrow if we are not in the will of God today.
 - D. When we are tired, we must think of Jesus. (Hebrews 12:1-4)
- IV. A willingness to be completely open with one another. Receive one another unconditionally. (James 5:16, Romans 15:7)
- V. A willingness to make a clean break with sin.
 - A. Separation does not mean isolation.
 - 1. We love people as they are, but we make a clean break with what they are doing.
 - 2. Bad company corrupts good morals. (I Corinthians 15:33)
 - B. We must hate sin. (Exodus 18:21, Psalm 119:128, Hebrews 1:8-9)
 - 1. Sin has four steps: seeing, coveting, taking, and hiding. (Joshua 7:20-21)
 - 2. A promise: unconfessed sin will bring you to shame. (Numbers 32:23)
