## I. Introduction.

- A. To finish well, we must lay aside every hindrance.
- B. The vocation of every believer is to grow in Christ and help others do the same.
- C. If we are not fishing for men, we are not following Jesus Christ. (Matthew 4:19; 28:19)
- II. The purpose of working with our hands is...
  - A. To provide goods and services beneficial to society broadly.
  - B. To provide constructive expressions of the gifts God has given us personally. (Exodus 35)
  - C. To make money for the necessities of life. (I Thessalonians 2:9, II Thessalonians 3:8, 10)
- III. The necessities of work.
  - A. Contentment. (I Timothy 6:6-8)
  - B. Faith. (Hebrews 11:6)
    - 1. Faith only functions in the realm of the impossible.
    - 2. We make a mockery of praying for things when we can easily accomplish them.
- IV. Things that are not necessary.
  - A. The real problem is faith, not one's wardrobe. We are to be anxious for nothing. (Matthew 6:25, John 14:21, Philippians 4)
  - B. Do not be anxious for the things of tomorrow. (Matthew 6:34)
  - C. We seek to grow in our faith—no one is in the same place. (Luke 17; Romans 12:3)
  - D. We ought to be careful of debt. (Romans 13:8, II Corinthians 6:10)

- E. We should not lay up earthly treasures. Only the souls of men will last. (Mathew 6, Jeremiah 23:28, II Peter 3:10, Luke 8:14)
- F. We must have such an intense love for Christ that every other relationship is secondary. (Luke 14:25, 43)
- G. The problem of accumulated riches is that we begin to trust in God and not man. (Jeremiah 17:5, Hebrews 12:16-17)
- H. God will provide today with today's needs. (II Corinthians 8:11)
- V. Guidelines for handling money.
  - A. How does it relate to the Great Commission?
  - B. Is it a need or a desire? (Philippians 4:18)
  - C. Have I asked God if this is God's method of supplying the need?
  - D. Are we using it wisely as the Lord's steward? (I Corinthians 4:1-2)
