 - A. Humility.
 - 1. David put others ahead of himself.
 - 2. God let David lead a nation because of how he led a flock of sheep. (Psalm 78:72)
 - B. Faithfulness. (Luke 16:12, Proverbs 27:23)
 - 1. We must be diligent to keep our own flocks.
 - 2. David's life was so ordered that he could handle additional responsibility, which became a door to greater opportunity.
 - C. A secret life.
 - 1. God chose the person who was as courageous in private as he was in public.
 - 2. You are what you are when you are all alone. (Acts 24:16, Psalm 24:3-4)
 - D. Faith.
 - 1. There will be times when God asks us to step out in faith. At some point, we will face a test.
 - 2. We encounter the enemy by faith. (Jeremiah 33:3)
