
## **Total Identify In Christ**

- I. Three things are important.
  - A. The word of God is crucial. (John 8:31)
    - 1. The word is the foundation of our life. (John 6:63)
    - 2. Every word of God is inspired and profitable. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)



- a. Instruction in truth.
- b. The world is looking for truth.
- c. Truth causes us to realize what is important.
- d. A plane needs guidance to fly and to land.
- e. We need guidance for godly living.
- f. Pilots need to be narrow minded in following directions.
- g. We need to be narrow minded in heeding God's direction.
- h. Satan tries to get us to ignore the word of God.

- i. We only grow as we get into the word of God.
- j. In military school I was drilled hard by instructors.
- k. I thought no Christians were in this school so I decided to go underground.
- 1. A Christian challenged me to study the Bible with him.
- m. He taught me to have a quiet time.
- n. I memorized my first verse. (John 1:12)
- o. I have never stopped memorizing the word.
- p. We never know enough to stop studying the word.
- B. Obedience is important. (John 14:21)
  - 1. Take heed to what we hear. (Mark 4:24)
  - 2. We need to obey. (James 1:12)
  - 3. We need to obey spiritual leaders. (Hebrews 13:17)
  - 4. Only be strong and careful to obey God. (Joshua 1:7-8)
  - 5. We succeed as we obey God and fail as we disobey, as King Saul did. (1 Samuel 15:1-24)
  - 6. Saul was rejected by God for his disobedience.
  - 7. Saul feared to obey God completely.
  - 8. We need to obey God all the way.
- C. Our identity with Jesus is important. (Luke 14:26-27)
  - 1. We cannot be disciples of Christ if we do not renounce all.
  - 2. Paul counted all as loss to gain Christ. (Philippians 3:7-11)
  - 3. Christ had no place to lay his head.
  - 4. We need to identify with Christ's life.

- 5. We know Christ as we leave the world behind. (Philippians 3:10)
- 6. Simon of Cyrene carried Christ's cross. He was a representative of his island to go to Passover.
  - a. He got caught up in the festivities of the celebration. He was surprised, however, by the commotion about Jesus.
  - b. The way of the cross must have shocked him.
  - c. Why would the King of the Jews be crucified this way?
  - d. Suddenly Simon was called on to carry the cross for Jesus. He must have felt guilty by association with Jesus.
  - e. He must have been impacted by Christ's gaze on him.
  - f. Fifty days later he might have heard the preaching of Peter on the day of Pentecost.
    - i. Peter told the truth about Jesus.
    - ii. Jesus Christ is the Messiah, the Savior of the world.
    - iii. Christ was crucified but has been raised from the dead.
    - iv. By faith in him we can have eternal life.
    - v. Simon might have wondered why one of his disciples didn't carry Jesus' cross. When he returned to Cyrene he had a story to tell.
- 8. Believers are the Simons of today.
  - a. God needs men and women to identify with Jesus' cross.
  - b. We each need to take up our crosses and follow Jesus.
- 9. Are you ready to be identified with Christ?
  - a. Let people k now that you are living for Christ.
  - b. Take Christ at his word.
  - c. Stop being a fringe Christian but live in the center of God's will.
