I. Introduction.

- A. Discipleship is optional for the Christian. (Matthew 28)
- B. Submitting to the Lordship of Christ is something that can only happen by way of decision.
- C. Three sins committed by non-Christians against the Spirit: blasphemy, resisting (Acts 7:51) and showing contempt (Hebrews 10:29).
- D. Three sins believers Christians commit against the Spirit: lying (Acts 5:3), grieving (Ephesians 4:30) and quenching (I Thessalonians 5:19).
- E. A disciple is learner.
- II. A disciple is a person who continues in the Word of God. (John 8:31-32)
 - A. A disciple is a learner—he is not static.
 - B. We must "continue" in the Word of God.
 - C. To continue means to listen, study Jesus' life, and penetrate the meaning and to obey. (Romans 15:18)
- III. A disciple is a person who walks in love. (John 13:34-35)
 - A. Love is unconditional and unending.
 - B. Jesus made Himself of no reputation by washing the disciples' dirty feet.
 - C. We ought to be involved in other people's heartache.
- IV. A disciple is a person who bears fruit. (John 15)
 - A. Fruit means character—Christ-likeness. (Galatians 5:22-23)
 - B. It also means influence or multiplied disciples. (Proverbs 11:30)
 - C. We bear fruit from the secret intimate life we have with Christ. (Romans 7:4)
