## I. Introduction.

- A. There are five laws for disciple making.
  - 1. Create an environment, which optimizes the possibility of personal discovery by the disciple. (II Kings 6, Ephesians 1:18)
  - 2. Give the disciple maximum opportunity for exposure to the truth commensurate with their capacity to comprehend and apply. (Isaiah 28:9-10)
  - 3. Help the disciple see and hear the truth simultaneously. (I Thessalonians 1)
  - 4. The disciple must "handle" us.
  - 5. The truth is sufficient as a final authority. (II Corinthians 13:8)
- B. There is curriculum for discipleship. (II Timothy 3:10)

#### II. Doctrine.

- A. God intended for us to pour truth into another.
- B. We model and incarnate doctrine by how we react to situations in life.
- C. One cannot believe wrong and live right.

# III. Lifestyle.

- A. Doctrine and lifestyle are equally important.
- B. Our basic manner of life should be one of approachability.
- IV. Purpose. Without objectives, we are likely running around in circles. (John 17:4)

## V. Faith.

- A. Faith is only as valid as its object.
- B. We are to put our faith upon the promises of God. (II Chronicles 6:17)
- C. Christ taught faith in the storm. (Mark 4)

VIII. Persecutions and afflictions.
A. Ninety percent of the Christian life is just getting up one more time.
