- B. It takes time to learn how to multiply.
- C. Our work is other men. (John 17:4)
- D. Multiplying comes through a deeper relationship with Christ.

#### IV. Possess the land.

- A. This is talking about personal fulfillment with our gifts.
- B. We need to give ourselves breathing room and time in discovering our gifts.
- C. There is a great deal of wait in the Christian life.
- D. We need to take time and savor what we have.
