## I. Introduction.

- A. Jesus loved the world, helped thousands and trained twelve. (John 17:4)
- B. We are all making disciples—the only question is what kind of disciples we are making. (Romans 14:7)
- C. There are four important qualities for being a disciple maker.
- II. The Great Commandment. (Matthew 22:37-40)
  - A. We are to love the Lord with all our hearts.
  - B. The heart refers to intelligence. (II Corinthians 3:15; 4:6; Ephesians 1:18; Romans 1:21)
  - C. The heart refers to the will.
  - D. The heart refers to character. (Romans 6:17; Ephesians 6:5; I Timothy 1:5; II Chronicles 5:22; Galatians 4:6; II Corinthians 1:22)
- III. A willingness to pay any price. (Luke 14:25-43)
  - A. Every test we pass qualifies us for a more difficult test.
  - B. We must pray and model.
- IV. Teach-ability/humility. (Luke 16)
  - A. Who you associate with is more important than what you believe.
  - B. One must take care who one plugs into emotionally. (Philippians 2:25, I Samuel 10:26)
  - C. Find people who are faithful in the little things, and they will keep coming back.
- V. Readiness and maturity.
  - A. Not everyone is ready to be a disciple.
  - B. The disciples took time learning before entering ministry.

C. God will give us a heart to know Him. (Jeremiah 24)
