I. Introduction.

- A. Learning about prayer on God's terms helps to pray more effectively consistently.
- B. God has certain conditions for prayer, most of which are couched in promises.
- II. We must pray in Jesus' name, which means to come before God with Jesus' merit. (John 14:12; 2 Corinthians 5:20)
 - A. We have no credit before God by ourselves.
 - B. We come to God on Jesus' behalf and merit.
- III. We must pray according to God's will. (1 John 5:14-15)
 - A. We must take the time to know what God's will is through the Scriptures.
 - B. When we do not know God's will, we can come before God and ask with the best of our knowledge. (Matthew 18:19)
 - C. We can pray for...
 - 1. Open eyes to see wonderful things in the Bible. (Psalm 119:18)
 - 2. Knowing the love of God and being filled with his fullness. (Ephesians 3:17)
 - 3. Leading a life worthy of Jesus. (Colossians 1:9)
 - 4. Bold utterance for using gifts. (Ephesians 6:19)
 - 5. The resources to do whatever he asks us, such as wisdom. (James 1:5)
- IV. God is not limited to our ability to see how he is going to answer prayer. (2 Kings 7; Jeremiah 32:27; Genesis 18:14; Ephesians 3:20; John 16:24)
