    - 1. Every Christian should become like Jesus Christ. (Romans 8:28)
    - 2. We are responsible to behave like Christ.
  - C. The will of God is also unique for individuals. God has a specific work for each to do. (Mark 13:34)
  - D. We live in two kingdoms and have responsibilities to both.
    - 1. Full time Christian service does not mean greater commitment.
    - 2. God has a perfect mission for each in the kingdom of man and the kingdom of society.
