- II. The fruit of the Spirit is self-control. (Galatians 5:22)
 - A. This means to be in control of one's faculties.
 - B. The idea has to do with being reasonable and moderate. (Acts 26:25, Romans 12:3)
 - C. This comes from the Spirit, God and discipline. (2 Timothy 1:7, 1 Timothy 4:7, Colossians 3:7, Philippians 2:12-13)
 - D. The Bible leaves things in tension for balance. God is at work, but we are to work out our own salvation. (Luke 14, 1 Peter 5)
 - E. Counselors also help us with self-control. (Proverbs 13:10)
- III. Lessons from Daniel.
 - A. Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile God.
 - B. Most of our basic attitudes towards life are derived from our parents.
 - C. Every problem that we have is directly related to our view of God.
 - 1. This is emotionally difficult to accept.
 - 2. Joseph recognized God's sovereign hand in difficulties. (Genesis 49:8; 50:20; Romans 8:28)
 - D. We need to maintain a distinction between doctrine (those beliefs we die for) and convictions. We must be diligent in studying the Scripture to know the difference. (Daniel 3:18, 2 Timothy 2:15)
 - E. A disciplined person is sensitive, loyal but confrontational. (Daniel 4, Job 2:25, 1 Corinthians 11:30, 2 Timothy 4:20)
 - F. We must not compromise truth at any cost. (Daniel 5)
 - G. The Christian life is combat all the way. (Daniel 6)
 - H. Disciplined people need to learn how to live in obscurity. (John 10:10)
 - I. The thought life must be replaced with thoughts upon Christ.
- IV. Personal application.
 - A. We are not to yield to sexual sin. (Romans 6:16-19)
 - B. We must deal with sin right up front. (Joshua 7:20-21, Proverbs 4:23-25)

C. We must be disciplined with our use of time. (Ephesians 5:15-16)

D. We must be faithful stewards with our use of money. (Luke 16:10-12)
