 - 2. II Thessalonians 3:1 Finally, brethren, pray for us that the word of the Lord may spread rapidly and be glorified, just as it did also with you.
 - 3. Philemon 1:22 And at the same time also prepare me a lodging; for I hope that through your prayers I shall be given to you.


