The Physical world often reflects principles of the Spiritual World. > Child Teenager > Adult **Spiritual Pediatrics** "Follow-up is, in effect, spiritual pediatrics" We have the privilege of providing the environment for this to happen. ·God uses many means to establish a new believer in his/her faith (corporate worship, small groups, Sunday school class, one to one) Key is one to one relationship. Life on Life. A Call to be Free ...Despite God's call to be free and His earnest admonition to resist all efforts to curtail it, there is little emphasis in Christian circles today on the importance of Christian freedom. Just the opposite seems to be true. Instead of promoting freedom, we stress our rules of conformity. Instead of preaching living by grace, we preach living by performance. Instead of encouraging new believers to be conformed to Christ, we subtry insist that they be conformed to our particular style of Christian culture. We do not intend to do this and would earnestly deny we are. Yet that's the "bottom line" effect of most of our emphases in Christian circles today...

Follow Up

- Flexibility with my friends circumstances (newborn, work, changing times)
- · Allowing my friend to make mistakes
