
Christ the Center & Obedience to Christ

The Wheel Illustration was developed by Dawson Trotman, founder of The Navigators, to help Christians understand their mission as disciples of Jesus Christ. Since the early 1930s, this word picture has encouraged countless Christians in their spiritual journey. In our workshop today, we are going to discuss the importance of Jesus Christ as the "Center" of our lives and our response of loving obedience to Him.

7.	What does God want men to do when they see an obedient Christian according to Matthew 5:13-16?
8.	What is the relationship between obedience and love according to Matthew 22:37-40, 2 Corinthians 5:14-21, and Titus 2:11-15?

Key Points

- The balance and shape of the wheel comes from the hub. The balance and shape of the Christian comes from Jesus Christ.
- The power for the wheel to move comes from the hub. The power for the Christian to move comes from an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ.
- The direction for the wheel comes from the hub. The direction for the Christian comes from an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ.
- When the wheel is moving, you do not see the spokes, only the hub. When the Christian is
 following Jesus Christ, you and others will not see the Christian life as an end unto itself, but as a
 dynamic relationship with the risen King!
- The rim on a wheel is where the 'rubber meets the road.' This is the reality of living the daily life of following Jesus Christ.
- Jesus Christ demands our obedience.
- Make no mistake; there are many challenges to daily obedience to Jesus Christ.
- It is impossible to say we love Jesus Christ and not to seek to obey Him.
- "Obedience is love reciprocated back to God."
