 - 1. It used to be that the pastor alone reached out to an entire flock.
 - 2. Today whole congregations are learning to share the Gospel with others.
 - 3. A man told of knocking on a neighbor's door to no avail.
 - 4. He left a note from Revelation 3:20 Behold I stand at the door and knock.
 - 5. The next day someone left a note from Genesis 3: I heard your voice and was afraid.
- B. My topic today is body life as a lifestyle.
 - 1. One thing that body life encompasses is a whole lifestyle.
 - 2. Our membership has caught on that body life continues in all encounters.
 - 3. Some may say I don't understand that.
 - 4. Well, it is not in Scripture but it encompasses all the one another aspects found in the Bible
 - a. Pray for one another.
 - b. Rebuke one another.
 - c. Love one another.
 - d. Serve one another.
 - e. Minister to one another.
 - f. Share with one another.
 - 5. Though the phrase of body life is not in Scripture the idea is.
 - 6. Leadership makes a commitment to the body and visa versa.
 - 7. We recognize that we belong one to another.
 - 8. We are members of one another.
 - 9. God intends the body to function like this.

- 10. Paul often used the physical body as a symbol of how the church is to function.
- 11. I once sprained my right wrist.
 - a. It was very painful.
 - b. The rest of my body stayed up all night caring for it.
 - c. When one member suffers the rest suffer with him or her.
 - d. We need to minister to one another.
- I. Today I want to talk of three things.
 - A. What is body life?
 - 1. We have already discussed this.
 - 2. We will move on.
 - B. How is body life taught and practiced?
 - 1. Preaching is to uncover the deep mysteries of God that God ordained for our edification.
 - a. The pulpit is where we state to teach about body life.
 - b. Many preachers would have less difficulty by emphasizing the idea of body life in their pulpits.
 - c. Preaching has an element of authority that no other element has.
 - d. We need to overcome the deep ends of tradition by preaching the truth of God's word.
 - e. Suggesting new methods that other churches are trying does not get results.
 - f. We must exegete Scripture.
 - g. This is liberating.
 - 2. Modeling is helpful in teaching body life.
 - a. Howard Hendricks brought out that certain people are ready to respond immediately.
 - b. They will open their homes to minister to one another.
 - c. The blessing of this will impact their families.
 - d. Get them to share in the service what is happening in their homes.

- e. If some have struggled through painful situations they will encourage others to get involved in a body life ministry.
 - 1. I heard of a church that had a little girl was killed at a swimming pool.
 - 2. The whole congregation had ministered to that family so that they survived the tragedy.
- f. Our tradition of hiding to be OK is not a biblical model.
- g. When we first began practicing body life at about church some resisted.
 - 1. It is not easy to talk of financial loss, or rebellious teenagers, or illness, etc.
 - 2. We began a body life service and some were reluctant to share.
 - 3. We realized that the leaders needed to break the ice.
 - 4. I shared about our daughter that lost her faith at college.
 - 5. Some were shocked.
 - 6. I shared little things about temptations to steal small things from hotels I visited.
 - 7. A woman asked for prayer about the cold relationship she has with her husband.
 - 8. Many commiserated with her.
- h. Body life breaks down resistance to open up.
- C. What results does body life produce in a congregation?
 - 1. Body life teaches people to be comfortable with others who don't see things as they do.
 - a. We need to stop taking the spiritual temperature of ourselves and others.
 - b. When people begin reaching out to other Christians they also learn to reach out to non-Christians.
 - c. We listened to reports of people in the congregation and realized many of them began without knowledge of the leadership.
 - 1. Some women began ministering to teenage girl that had gotten pregnant.
 - a. Two women started a crisis pregnancy center.
 - b. This ministry has grown to hundreds.

- 4. Others began ministering to handicapped children.
 - a. They take the worst possible cases.
 - b. I can hardly stand to see the poor children they minister to.
- 3. Another woman with an unbelieving husband continued to minister to her own family and began ministering to refugees.
 - a. They have needs of furniture and health care and English.
 - b. Now she has a dozen families or so to whom she ministers.
- 4. Another family met some Vietnamese people.
 - a. They have assisted 60 Vietnamese people.
 - b. They teach English and Scripture.
- 5. Another young man ministers to ex cons.
- 6. A nurse found that her doctors had surplus medicine.
 - a. She took the medication and sent them to Africa.
 - b. She found a transport company that sent the supplies free.
- 7. A former lesbian is ministering to the gay culture.
 - a. She knows how to talk to them with condemning them.
 - b. She is being effective in leading them to freedom.
- d. We need to bread the tradition of not getting involved in others' lives.
- 2. There are seven things.
 - a. Increasingly widespread involvement in the lives of others.
 - b. Excitement increases in the members of the congregation.
 - c. Needy ministries are taking place in our churches.
 - 1. Despair is growing in our culture.
 - 2. Violence and hatred is growing in our culture.
 - 3. Body life meets some of these needs.
 - d. Evangelism is occurring in greater effectiveness.

- 1. Not with artificial surveys.
- 2. But with genuine concern.
- 3. People are coming to Christ.
- 4. People are being baptized.
- e. It lessens administration in the church.
 - 1. People are being equipped to do the work of ministry.
 - 2. People are responsible to the Lord directly.
 - 3. Even if there are heresies among them praise the Lord anyway.
 - 4. We like to discuss with people issues of doctrine but we don't take a heavy hand.
 - 5. I have not known any group that has gone
- f. Spiritual growth and understanding is increasing.
- g. Church discipline is carried out in small groups.
 - 1. Resistant people listen when small groups deal with them. (Matthew 18)
 - 2. Rarely do we need to bring an issue to the entire church.
 - a. One man was confronted about his homosexuality.
 - b. He left the church but went through psychotic hell and eventually repented.
 - c. We embraced him and rejoiced with him and had a party for him.
 - d. Now he leads a weeknight prayer meeting.

II. Conclusion.

- A. The Bible commands to minister to one another.
 - 1. Love one another.
 - 2. Serve one another; pray for one another confess to one another; reach out to one another.

III. Questions and Answers:

- A. How does the church respond to help people minister to difficult people?
 - 1. We provide counseling and support. Some people won't change and can't be helped but we must do what we can.
 - 2. We have a girl that finds it difficult to trust the Lord yet she yearns for attention.
 - 3. We have been very patient with her and she is beginning to come out of her isolation.
- B. How does a church reach across cross cultural barriers?
 - 1. Churches seldom function as corporate bodies, but as individuals.
 - 2. We have tried to reach out to a black community near us.
 - 3. Our corporate efforts were minimally be effective but some of our individuals actually joined their church and that helped a lot.
 - 4. Through faith and patience we inherit the promises.
- C. What small groups do we support?
 - 1. We have singles, young married, and senior adults.
 - 2. It's not helpful for a leader to organize a meeting; it's more helpful for individuals to organize such meetings.
- D. Do we ever add these people to our staff?
 - 1. Yes, six of our 12 pastors came to us in this way.
 - 2. They are excellent pastors.
 - 3. Some of them have made marvelous preachers.
- E. How do we handle people that share gross immorality in meetings?
 - 1. There are some sins that are mentioned in meetings but never in a lewd way. People don't brag about their former lifestyle.
 - 2. If they do we gently say to them, "For a minute it sounded like you were proud of your former lifestyle, but we know you're not, are you?"
- F. What do we do when people reach the age of 18 when professed Christians should live like Christians?
 - 1. We need to love people.
 - 2. We don't expose sin in order to disbar people.
 - 3. We expose sin in order to minister to people.
