Stand Firm in Advancing the Gospel Paul Stanley

Introduction:

- A. We worked in Vienna Austria where advancing the Gospel is hard work.
- B. How do we get involved in the Great Commission?
- I. The Great Commission is Jesus' command to all disciples.
 - A. This was Jesus' last will and testament. (Matthew 18:16-20)
 - 1. It's not about loud proclamation with a bullhorn.
 - 2. It's about quietly proclaiming Christ.
 - 3. A layman asked how many people in a crowd came to Christ through a message over the radio or evangelistic campaign.
 - a. Most people came to Christ through a close relationship with another.
 - b. Christian leaders are like secret agents moving in the world.
 - c. The message they carry is empowered by Christ's love.
 - 4. The Great Commission is simple, to make disciples.
 - a. We are not called to make converts.
 - b. We are called to make disciples who follow Jesus Christ.
 - c. Discipleship is not a course to take but a life to live.
 - d. Discipleship is public identification with Christ.
 - 5. The Great Commission involves teaching disciples to obey Christ.
 - a. We are not to be free thinkers but obedience.
 - b. We don't obey naturally.
 - c. We disobey naturally, like children.
 - d. Usually 10 percent of people get jobs done.
 - e. Gideon had 30,000 troops to defeat Midian but God whittled it down to a remnant. (Judges 7)

- 1. Those who feared and who lapped water like a dog were eliminated.
- 2. The unafraid and watchful were chosen.
- 3. One percent of the 30,000 led the charge.
- f. Nearly 50 percent of Americans call themselves born again yet only a remnant of people actually engage in evangelism.
- g. Jesus chooses his own disciples. (John 15:16)
 - 1. He prunes branches to produce more fruit.
 - 2. He eliminates branches that bear no fruit.
 - 3. If we want to bear fruit we will be pruned.
 - 4. Those who remain in Christ will bear much fruit.
 - 5. Jesus is concerned with fruit bearing.
 - 6. Some fruit is internal, like live and joy. (Galatians 5)
 - 7. Some fruit is external involving others. (Matthew 9:37)
 - 8. Laborers are simple people that follow Christ.
- B. Four things that help keep us bearing fruit for Christ.
 - 1. Abiding in Christ. (John 15:5)
 - a. What does abiding mean to you?
 - 1. Remain.
 - 2. Obey.
 - 3. Confide in him.
 - b. It is a love relationship walking together in trust and confidence.
 - 1. Jesus called his disciples friends, though he remained Lord.
 - 2. If you were beginning a relationship with a potential spouse you wouldn't meet merely for a few moments each morning.
 - 3. At 25 I was in the military in Vietnam commanding a company of 200 men where I led many of these soldiers to Christ.

- 4. A Cambodian taught me about servanthood by giving me a servant.
 - i. This servant knew fighting and hung out with me.
 - ii. He went with me everywhere to protect me.
 - iii. He saved me from stepping on a land mine.
 - iv. He had a sixth sense moving about in the jungle.
 - v. He would set up a hammock for me to sleep on.
 - vi. He would prepare meals for me when I was too busy to eat.
 - vii. One night a snake surprised me and he caught it and cooked it.
 - viii. We developed a close friendship and he often saw me reading my Bible.
 - ix. When our time together was over he cried.
 - x. This kind of close relationship is abiding.
- 5. Jesus wants us to walk closely with him like this.
 - i. If we walk closely like this Christ will empower us.
 - ii. If we don't understand the Holy Spirit we will not abide. (1 Corinthians 3:16; John 16)
 - iii. Only the Holy Spirit knows what to pray for. (Romans 8:26-27)
 - iv. We think we know what school our kids should go to but the Spirit knows what is best.
 - v. When we pray don't tell the Spirit information, we need to ask the Spirit what to pray for.
- 2. Obey Christ's word. (Mark 4:14-20)
 - a. There are four souls.
 - 1. Hard.
 - 2. Rocky.
 - 3. Thorny.

- 4. Good soil.
- b. What kind of harvest do you want?
- c. Fruitfulness is directly related to obedience.
- 3. A heart for the lost.
 - a. Paul desired himself to be cut off if it would benefit his people. (Romans 9:2-3)
 - b. I had a pagan roommate I did not like, yet when something terrible happened to him he turned tome.
 - c. I shared Christ with him and he responded.
 - 4. We have to fight for the souls of people.
 - a. Some we don't naturally like may become great saints.
- 4. We need a partner in ministry (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10)
 - a. We can help each other in the battle.
 - b. Jonathan needed his armor bearer. (1 Samuel 14:6-7)
 - c. Two guys at a school began a great Bible study. (Matthew 18:19)
