 - 2. The world is as pagan as ever.
 - C. Elements of the parable.
 - 1. The meal.
 - a. This represented the meal offering that was to be unleavened.
 - b. This more specifically symbolized the fellowship of humanity sharing the life of God.
 - c. The key thing about the believers' lives was that they were called unto the fellowship of God's Son. (I Corinthians 1, I John)
 - 2. The leaven.
 - a. Every Scripture taught that the three measures of the meal were to be unleavened.
 - b. Leaven always means something bad. (I Corinthians 5)
 - 3. The bread.
 - a. The bread stands for openness and honesty.
 - b. Leaven is anything that distorts this.
 - c. Leaven is legalism in Galatians.
 - 4. The woman.

- a. A woman represents authority in the home.
- b. The most precious thing is fellowship with God and His people.
- c. It is the leaders of the church who bring in the leaven into the body.
- D. Openness is the solution because the church shares the life of God and has received His forgiveness freeing us to be one with someone else.
 - 1. The church has emphasized preaching but has lost fellowship.
 - 2. Outsiders see nothing different about the church.
- E. Leaven manifests itself in many ways today—the philosophy of the world, materialism, immorality, etc.
