I. Introduction.

- A. Text: I Corinthians 5:1-13.
- B. Sexual immorality is an increasing problem in the church.

II. The Corinthians faced the problem of incest.

- A. The Corinthians were boasting in their tolerance of this condition.
- B. The true attitude of the church ought to be grief.
- C. Steps to take when immorality is present.
 - 1. There must be a right attitude of mourning and grief.

2. There must be a right basis of discipline. There are certain things that the Word of God has already judged.

a. We are to tell a person what they are doing and if they listen, that is the end of the issue.

b. If the transgressor will not hear a person, the issue must go public.

c. If he will not hear the church, the church is to change its attitude toward himhe is to be treated as a nonbeliever. (Matthew 18)

3. There must be a right action taken--the transgressor is to be delivered unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh.

- a. The church is to think of the person as under the domain of Satan.
- b. He is to be treated as an unbeliever.
- c. The church is to act regardless of the threat because it is by the power of Jesus.
- d. The individual is not necessarily to be ejected, only treated differently.
- e. No punishment is ever assessed.
- 4. All discipline ceases when the person repents.
- D. Reasons the church must take action.
 - 1. A little evil in the church affects the whole church--the infection spreads.

- 2. Judgment makes present the demonstration of reality.
- 3. Judgment allows for the celebration of Christian liberty.
- E. The church is only to judge those within, not outsiders. They are to reach out to outsiders.
- F. The church is to judge itself on a clear-cut basis.
