- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: I Corinthians 11:17-24.
 - B. The main thing is what the Person and work of Christ means to a person.
 - C. The early church gathered for a meal, but divisions among them were spoiling it.
- II. It is healthy to have differences in the church.
 - A. It allows people to become mature.
 - B. No one had answered the divisions in the church at Corinth though resulting in something negative.
- III. Paul suggests that if the believers are only coming together to eat and drink, they might as well stay home.
 - A. When they come together, they ought to be concerned about the needs of others.
 - B. The indifference of the church was hurting the cause of Christ instead of helping it.
- IV. What Paul had taught them about the Lord's Supper.
 - A. Jesus Himself told Paul of what happened in the Upper Room.
 - B. The body of Christ is intended for the believer to live on. Jesus' life in the believer empowers him to be what Jesus asks Him to be. (John 6)
 - C. The blood reflects the death of the old self that the believer must undergo.
 - 1. The power of God only comes when we surrender the power of man.
 - 2. The old life dies in order that the new life might live.
- V. God guards the table of the Lord from unworthy partaking.
 - A. A proper participation requires an appropriate participation.
 - B. Examining oneself does not mean that perfection is demanded. Instead, one is to call sin what it is and repent of it. (Psalm 51)
 - C. The body must be discerned.
 - 1. The symbols are to be reflected upon.
