- I. Introduction. Text: II Timothy 1:1-7.
- II. It was Paul's greatest boast that he had been called to be an Apostle by the will of God.
 - A. He reminds Timothy that he speaks as an authentic spokesperson of the gospel.
 - B. He calls the gospel the promise of life.
 - 1. The gospel is the power of God for salvation. (Romans 1:16)
 - 2. The gospel is a treasure within.
 - 3. The gospel is unsearchable riches.
 - 4. The gospel is Christ within.
 - 5. The gospel is the glorious message of the blessed God.
 - C. All human beings have a hunger for life—only in the good news is this quality of life found.
 - 1. Grace, mercy and peace make up the daily supply for the life in Christ.
 - 2. Grace gives us the forgiveness of sins daily and the consciousness of God's love and presence.
 - 3. Mercy withholds the punishment we deserve.
 - 4. Peace is the inner sense of well-being when one realizes that there is a way through the trial no matter how dark it looks.
- III. Paul's prayer for Timothy.
 - A. God is to be the ground of our confidence, not circumstances.
 - B. One can have confidence in prayer because of a cleansed conscience.
 - C. Paul prayed constantly for Timothy because of...
 - 1. Timothy's tears of love.
 - 2. His sincere faith.
 - 3. Timothy's spiritual gift.
 - 4. There was clearly the indwelling Spirit of God in him.
