1. Paul did nothing except that which would contribute to his aim--to please God. (II Corinthians 5)

2. Christianity is not about special things--it is a special way of doing everything.

3. Faith enables this--the consciousness of invisible realities.

4. Paul was patient towards people despite the difficulty.

5. If one wants a person to be patient with him, then it is only right to be patient with another.

6. Love looks at everyone as valuable.

7. Endurance bears all things.

F. Paul reviews persecutions that he underwent.

1. One never really understands a person until he knows what he has gone through.

2. The early experiences of Paul's persecution burnt themselves into Timothy's mind-when you become a Christian, God does not necessarily protect you from peril.

1. Paul learned the secret of the divine presence.
