

God's Infinitude – Part 1

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I. Introduction. (Colossians 3:1-3)

A. Your life is hidden with Christ in God.

1. “Suddenly, the Trinity filled my heart with joy...”
2. Heaven will be heaven because of the Trinity’s presence there.
3. Jesus Christ is the full complete manifestation of the Trinity.
 - a. He has set forth all the glory that God is.
 - b. Where Jesus is glorified and loved, God is glorified and loved. (1 John 4:16, John 17:20)

II. God is all that we would desire.

A. Christianity is a gateway to God.

1. It is a journey unto infinitude - numberless experiences.

B. God is infinite.

1. The hardest thing to comprehend; one does not have to grasp it. Reason kneels to it.
2. God knows no limits, bounds, nor ends. He is without them entirely.
3. There is no thing that is boundless besides Him even though we use it as a form of expression.
4. Measurement is a way that created things account for themselves.
5. God is self-existent and absolute. Everything else is relative.
6. “Unbounded, un-extended unity.”
 - a. God does not extend space, He contains space.
 - b. The analogy of C.S. Lewis: God as a piece of paper and time as a line on it.
7. If God’s knowledge was *almost* everything, then He would not be infinite.
 - a. If this is not the case, He is not worthy of our worship. (Col 3)
