Voice of the Soul

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I. Luke 12:16.

A. Meaning.

- 1. Preceding context: brothers come to Jesus to have him settle family disputes over property, and Jesus warned not to covet.
- 2. Following context: have no thought about what you should eat, etc.
- B. The eternal work of the soul as compared to all else.
 - 1. The voice of God is heard through different channels, telling us that we will not be hear long, but there is a door to another world through Jesus' crucifixion. Faith is that door.
 - 2. The neglected soul has a voice too, and it is saying the same things.
- C. The soul has been forgotten today.
 - 1. This is assumed in the Bible.
 - 2. All we see is the appearance of a man, but we do not see the person the soul.
 - 3. We are not bodies having souls. We are souls having bodies.
 - 4. The word soul and spirit in the Bible are often used synonymously showing that while you can think of them apart, they are actually inseparable.
 - a. More than one meaning for death.
 - b. A man's soul never ceases to exist.
 - c. Seventh Day Adventists confuse immortality with eternal life.
 - 1) Eternal life is the life with God.
 - 2) Continued existence is what is meant by immortality.
 - a) You cannot snuff out a soul.
 - b) There, however, is a separation of the material and immaterial.
 - 5. All religions have taken for granted that the soul exists.

- a. Only when you have been educated beyond your good can you deny a future existence.
- b. There is something shocking and terrible about not believing in the soul.
- c. Believing in the soul is a test of humanity.
- D. We tend to the essential material less than the inconsequential material.
 - 1. Too many spend their time on their body, when they need more attention to the soul.
 - 2. The soul is the primary thing in you.
- II. The soul is trying to say something to you.
 - A. Jesus said to be concerned with the one who can destroy the souls of men, rather than the body.
 - 1. The Bible teaches that if the soul is saved, everything is saved.
 - 2. If the soul is lost, than everything is lost.
 - B. Jesus died for our bodies too.
 - 1. The ultimate goal is to be embodied.
 - 2. We are temporarily separated.
 - 3. But the first body is laid away and is no longer the body we attain to.
 - 4. The Lord wants everything to be clothed even the soul.
 - a. He clothes us in an intermediate body after death.
 - b. He then clothes us in a permanent resurrected body.
 - C. But the man who lives for this world only, dies a pauper.
 - D. The soul can be lost.
 - 1. By neglecting that it can be lost.
 - 2. By being unclean and neglected.
 - E. Jesus offered His soul for us.
 - 1. The fact that Jesus is risen should be central to Christian thought.
