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- I. Introduction. (Revelation 3:1)
- II. Three texts.
 - A. The Gospel may come in word only (empty) or in moral power (effectiveness).
 - 1. Paul knew that the gospel had come to the Thessalonians with moral power.
 - a. They had a strange and supernatural joy the joy of the Holy Spirit.
 - b. They became a missionary church.
 - 2. If it is true that this is what happens through moral power, then the opposite is also true.
 - a. They could be poor examples, lukewarm according to missionary zeal, and lacking joy if the gospel did not come in power.
 - B. The gospel received in power brings regeneration.
 - 1. The first creation passes away and everything becomes new.
 - C. There are those who have heard the gospel in word only they are Christians in name only.
 - 1. There is no fundamental change.
 - 2. The "Christian" is still dead.
 - 3. Regeneration must occur because sin came and we died.
- III. What it means to have the gospel to come in word.
 - A. It is possible for the gospel to come to us yet without power.
 - 1. Jesus shared that men were dead in their sins, yet those men killed him.
 - B. Being aware of the religious word game.
 - 1. The Holy Spirit is warning us about people who receive the gospel as a fact and only as a fact.
 - 2. This is nothing more than a game creating a problem for the sole end of solving it.
 - a. The problem never existed previously with games.
 - b. Nobody is ever better or worse off no matter what happens in a game.

- 3. When you are fighting a war, it does matter.
- 4. The temptation of those in religion is to take it as a word game.
 - a. The religious word game changes no one.
 - b. A survey found that the ethics of business men were not different for those who were religious.
- 5. Problems.
 - a. Egotism.
 - b. Selfishness.
 - c. The roots of the life have not been changed.
- 6. Christians are largely ineffective because they do not believe what they are doing.
- IV. What it means to have the gospel come in power.
 - A. A man becomes born again.
 - 1. The word is overused, but it is in the Book so it is important to use.
 - B. The things that occur.
 - 1. A man is exchanged from the external to the internal.
 - a. The new man sees the transcendency of the things eternal.
 - b. There is a shift of interest into a new sphere.
 - 2. There is a dedication to the honor of God.
 - a. The desire is to be approved by God and not by man.
 - b. We want to be popular with the Boss and not the crowd.
 - 3. Proprietorship changes to stewardship.
 - a. We simply give back to God what was His in the first place.
 - b. As soon as we think we own anything, that thing becomes a curse to us.
 - C. Raising culture above the word of God.
 - 1. Missionary dangers.
 - 2. The example of Sodom and Gomorra.

- D. If the gospel does not transform, it is not effective.
 - 1. Our moral code comes from what Christ says, and not what others say.
 - 2. In all what Jesus says, the Christian acts upon and lives by totally.
 - 3. The Christian will take up His cross and follow Jesus no matter what the cost.
- V. The danger that it should only come in word and what we should do about it.
 - A. There are millions that have a name to live but are dead.
 - 1. Too few think this is true of themselves.
 - 2. Everyone could use some heart searching.
 - 3. The only thing left to do is to turn your life over to Jesus.

2. Describe the man changed by the gospel come in power. Why is a change so fundamental to the Christian life?
