- I. What is it to accept Christ? (2 Peter 1:10)
  - A. There are few things that matter much in the world. There are few things that are a matter of life or death.
  - B. Some things are essential though.
    - 1. A compass on the ocean.
    - 2. Water in the desert.
    - 3. One's relationship with Christ.
      - a. We are either right or we are wrong.
      - b. Avoiding it is making absolutely sure that one will perish.
- II. How do I come into saving relationship with Jesus Christ?
  - A. Three answers (usually interchangeable).
    - 1. Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. (Acts 16)
    - 2. Receive Christ. (John 1:12)
    - 3. Accept Christ.
      - a. Being used as a panacea for all problems worldwide.
      - b. What does this really mean?
  - B. The fatality of easy acceptance.
    - 1. It makes the whole attitude wrong.
    - 2. Christ does not cater to our pleasures He is the sovereign Lord.
    - 3. Accepting Christ without following Him is the same as the Israelites staying in Egypt after the Passover.
    - 4. The example of the Prodigal Son who never returned.
  - C. Christ was very clear about it.

- 1. There was always a clear mark of demarcation concerning repentance and salvation.
- 2. Today churches sell out the message to get members.
- D. To accept Christ is to form an attachment with Christ that is revolutionary and complete it leaves no part of the life unaffected.
  - 1. The really saved man has found Jesus Christ the supreme interest in his life.
  - 2. A modern heresy is Lordship you cannot accept Christ in pieces.
  - 3. The offices of Jesus cannot be divided.
- E. To accept Christ is to...
  - 1. Accept Christ's friends as our friends.
  - 2. Have a moral sweetness about one's life.
  - 3. Accept Jesus' enemies as our own.
  - 4. Never get along without the stigmata of the cross.
    - a. We should always keep something of the shame of the cross on us.
    - b. We must accept the cross that he accepted.
- F. Being filled with the Spirit.
  - 1. Dying with Jesus.
  - 2. Accepting Jesus' cross as our cross.
  - 3. Then getting off of the cross.
- G. His future is your future.
  - 1. We should not want to go anywhere where Jesus cannot go.
  - 2. There is no compromise.
  - 3. The example of a preacher friend who would spend six months to search his own heart.
