HOW? How do D-Groups?

- 1. Description.
 - 2-6 men or women
 - Any time
 - Any place
 - Purpose To help each other grow
 - Potential Easily transferable
 - Process
 - Simple (time, prep, ability to lead, method)
 - Personal (see, know, help each other individually)
 - o Nutritious (do the essentials of biblical growth/discipleship).
- 2. Method.
 - UP (25 min).
 - **Read (5 minutes).** Find a book of the Bible that fits your group, and read a chapter each time you get together until you finish the book.
 - **Journal.** (5 minutes). After you've read your chapter, go back and ask, "What is God saying to me?" In just two or three sentences write what you are hearing.
 - Share. (15 minutes). Have each man simply read what he wrote and add clarifying comments.
 - IN (25 minutes). Ask and have each answer a "life question."
 - OUT (10 minutes). Each pray for each other and for his "One" who needs Jesus.
