## Introduction:

- A. The Navigators have a unique name.
- B. We are talking about gifting.
  - 1. Gifts help us to make our ultimate contribution in life.
  - 2. The older we get the more we focus on our gifts.
  - 3. Prophecy is not about the future but a correction to call people back to truth.
    - a. Exhortation works differently.
    - b. Prophecy can be perceived as critical.
    - c. Those with the gift of prophecy need to learn how to handle it.
- C. We talked about God's providential working yesterday.
  - 1. God has us in positions for a purpose.
  - 2. When our purpose is finished we go home. (Psalm 139:16)
  - 3. God is even in our diseases for he is sovereign.
  - 4. I know a couple who lost their teenage daughter in a car crash.
  - 5. In today's tragic world we need to believe in the sovereignty of God.
  - 6. We need to know who we are and who God is.
- D. We talked about God's faithfulness. (Luke 16:10-12)
  - 1. God is the real promoter.
  - 2. God causes our growth. (1 Corinthians 4:1-2)
- E. We talked about the need for feedback and perspective.
  - 1. We need this through all the age phases of life.
  - 2. My son went through a job interview process and was offered a job from two companies.
    - a. How does he choose between the two?

- b. Both were attractive offers.
- c. I counseled him to go where he would be pushed to trust God the most.
- d. He needs to grow in faith, with good feedback and perspective.
- 3. Twenty year olds are in danger of depending too much on relationships.
  - a. They are influenced by what's going on in life.
  - b. They need good evaluative feedback.
  - c. Ask them questions about how they would do things better.
  - d. I met a 38 year old man in business and told him about my work with Navigators.
  - e. He wanted to know more about leadership development so I told him about evaluative feedback.
  - f. What works well, and what does not work well.
  - g. He enjoyed this and I was able to identify his strengths and weaknesses.
  - h. We can mentor people just by asking them good questions.
  - i. Get involved in the life of some twenty year old in your church.
- 4. Twenty year olds also have little concentration on the inner life.
  - a. They are too busy.
  - b. We need to model concentration on inner life.
- I) Today we want to talk of the contribution stage of the 30s.
  - A. We will all appear before the Lord to give account of our lives. (2 Corinthians 5:9-10)
    - 1. Joseph is a good example of one that was a good steward.
    - 2. Good stewards are commended in Scripture. (Matthew 25)
    - 3. Adam and Eve were called to rule over the earth. (Genesis 1:28)
      - a. We all rule in our own sphere of influence.
      - b. We are to bring our lives to full maturity, able to bless others.

- c. Farmers understand this principle of ruling and subduing and multiplying.
- 4. We need to understand who we are so we can impact others.
- B. Areas of concern.
  - 1. The 30s is the most precious time of life today.
    - a. They are starting to have families.
    - b. They begin to look back at the end of the 30s.
    - c. They produce on their jobs.
    - d. They become leaders.
  - 2. The 30s might be a place where they can't hear God's voice.
    - a. Life is too intense.
    - b. When we can't hear God's voice it's not an ear problem but a relational problem.
  - 3. There intimacies are crucial.
    - a. With God.
    - b. With mate.
    - c. With children.
  - 4. Mentors are important to keep us on track.
    - a. When people are under fire they need help of experience.
    - b. They need to hear affirmation from someone older.
    - c. 30 year olds need perspective and affirmation.
    - d. Few 30s realize they are doing a good job with their kids.
  - 5. They need perspective on their careers.
- II) In the 40s people begin to contemplate their mortality.
  - A. Our bodies tell us we are not immortal.
    - 1. We age and just can't do what we use to do.

- 2. I used to play sports with my sons but my body couldn't produce.
- B. Two areas of concern.
  - 1. This time of second thoughts cause us to question ourselves.
    - a. This can be good.
    - b. This can lead to a terrible mid life crisis.
    - c. During this time we should correct our course.
  - 2. Dabbling and plateauing can be dangerous.
    - a. Dabbling is doing a little of everything and not concentrating on our gifts.
      - 1. The older we get the wiser we should be with our time.
      - 2. Some parents teach out of guilt, though they are not gifted as teachers.
      - 3. This is a fireman approach, dousing fires with available hands.
      - 4. This hinders focus on God's gifting in your life.
      - 5. This causes a loss of energy in life and abdicating to the young.
    - b. Plateauing is where we level off.
      - 1. We decide to get by with what we know.
      - 2. When we quit learning we quit growing.
      - 3. Thus we cannot mentor the younger.
      - 4. If we learn who we are we become resources to the young.
- C. The greatest need in mentoring is coaching.
  - 1. We need coaches in every phase of life and in every undertaking.
  - 2. We need coaches who know who they are.
- III) The 50s are also crucial.
  - A. Two things these folks need to focus on.
    - 1. They need to leave al legacy.

- 2. They want to finish well.
  - a. When I turned 50 I was excited because I was old enough to know some things yet young enough to still do some things.
  - b. I can quote myself now.
  - c. A 40 year old cannot approach 30-somethings with advice but 50s can.
- B. Characteristics of 50s.
  - 1. Generosity is a great characteristic of the 50s. (2 Corinthians 8:9)
  - 2. We have trouble getting 50s connected.
    - a. Churches segregate groups by age and we cannot connect.
    - b. We need vertical connections.
    - c. The older are not connected to the younger.
    - d. In this room we have enough wisdom to solve many problems.
      - 1. Strong willed children.
      - 2. Financial trouble.
      - 3. Health issues.
  - 3. Why are we not connected better?
    - a. Lack of trust between generations.
    - b. Younger feel older advice is beneath them.
  - 4. What would help us connect?
    - a. We need to address this generation gap.
    - b. Older folks are like oaks of righteousness. (Isaiah 61:3-4)
      - 1. Oaks don't produce acorns until it is 50.
      - 2. Once it produces it gives out thousands.
    - c. We want to leave a legacy of other mature believers.
    - d. Billy Graham said he lived with no regrets.

- 5. The keys to finishing well are mentoring and peers.
  - a. If you did not develop peers in the 30s and 40s you will have trouble finishing well.
  - b. Some people love what they do because it suits them and some do not.
  - c. Those who love their work finish well.
  - d. One friend offered to pay me \$5000 to teach a seminar on leadership to his company.
  - e. I asked my mentor about the offer and he reminded me of our covenant to serve the Lord by making disciples.
  - f. I also read biographies such as George Muller who claimed the promises of God for his ministry.
  - g. I needed to be reminded of my life calling by a mentor in order to refuse the lure of the world and keep serving God.
- 6. Each life age needs the other live ages to help them develop into the persons created them to be.
  - a. We need to help each other.
  - b. The 50s need to ask the 20s and 30s about how they plan to end well.
  - c. It doesn't take a lot to get involved in another's life.
  - d. He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose.
  - e. Tomorrow we will talk about what makes a good mentor.
