I. Introduction.
A. Do not let conflict get away from you.
B. The primary deterrent of conflict resolution is pride.

II. Steps to resolving conflict.
A. Get together with the other party and identify the problem (it may just be a misunderstanding).
B. The right attitude is essential.
C. Brainstorm all possible solutions that might help.
D. Evaluate solutions.
E. Figure out responsibilities.
F. If the process does not work, revisit possible solutions.
III. Headship is the leadership of love—it is not dictatorial. Headship accomplishes objectives and watches out for the welfare of those involved. (Ephesians 5)
A. Men need to initiate communication and maintain it just as Christ did.
B. Spending time in God's Word will help us most in gaining perspective on how to love our wives.
C. All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction and righteousness. (2 Timothy 3:16-17, Hebrews 4:12)
