I. Introduction.

- A. Jesus loved the world, helped many and trained twelve. (John 17:4)
- B. One must become disillusioned with himself in order to mature.

C. Peter went through different phases: success, disillusion, recovery.

II. Success. (Luke 5:1-11; 6; 8; 9:20)

A. Peter had great success with Christ.

B. Peter had to go through failure though to find maturity.

III. Disillusionment. (Luke 22:45, 50, 54)

IV. Recovery.

A. Step one in recovery is being gut-level honest with the Lord. Peter could only love Jesus with *agape* love. We must be moving in the right direction even though it is not easy. (John 21)

B. Step two is not losing our outward focus. We must let go what we cannot hold onto. (Acts 3)

C. Step three is recognizing that we need the team more than they need us. (Acts 12, Philippians 2:25)
