    - 1. Living with purpose in all we do.
      - a. Bible study.
      - b. Work.
    - 2. In all areas of life ask, "Why are we doing this?"
  - B. What does it mean to live with purpose?
    - 1. An immigrant to America opened a flower shop.
      - a. He didn't just sell flowers; he made beauty.
      - b. He ministered to a man looking for flowers for his wife.
      - c. That man came back to tell him his wife loved the flowers.
      - d. That man realized that he really did sell beauty.
    - 2. What do you sell?
      - a. The day is exciting if you sell beauty.
      - b. Purpose gives meaning to life.
    - 3. Purpose is revealed by God.
      - a. A man in Africa has been ministering in Chad.
      - b. He has a plan to quit his job and minister there full-time.
      - c. I asked him his purpose.

- d. I suggested it is to reveal God to people around him.
- e. Think of purpose rather than plans.
- f. Thinking this way brought meaning to his life and ministry.
- g. It became a family project for him to reveal God.
- h. A year later he told me how God used him to lead five men to Christ.
- i. God is a God of purpose.
- j. We are to be people of purpose.
- k. We all have a very distinctive purpose.
- 1. Each one of us is perfect for God's purpose.
- m. Even if your home life was difficult God uses that for good.
- n. In Acts the disciples got into trouble for preaching Jesus but one man said to leave them alone for if their purpose was of God it cannot be stopped. (Acts 5:38-39)
- o. We are created in Christ for good works which God has prepared in advance. (Ephesians 2:10)
- p. God has good plans for his people. (Jeremiah 29:11)
- q. Abraham's purpose was to father a nation.
- r. Joseph was to preserve his family from famine.
- s. How we respond to difficult situations prepares us.
- t. Moses was a deliverer.
- u. Jochbed the mother of Moses cared for Moses.
- v. David led the people.
- w. Nehemiah rebuilt the wall.
- x. Mary gave her body to God.
- y. Joseph protected baby Jesus.
- z. Jesus brought the kingdom.
- aa. Paul and Barnabas preached.

- bb. God has a purpose for each one of us.
- C. How do we understand our purpose as we follow Christ?
  - 1. We must hold to God's word. (John 8:31)
  - 2. We are to bear much fruit. (John 15:5)
  - 3. Love one another. (John 18:34-35)
  - 4. Deny self and take up our cross. (Luke 9:23)
  - 5. The Great Commission. (Matthew 28:19-20)
    - a. God develops us as we follow his purposes.
    - b. God works ion us. (Philippians 2:13)
  - 6. We have needs everywhere ands some attract us.
    - a. When these needs move into a concern they become ours.
    - b. When we begin praying "send me," God gets us involved.
    - c. Concerns become burdens as with Nehemiah.
    - d. When the king saw his sad face he inquired what was wrong.
    - e. Burdens move us to do something.
    - f. Nehemiah got involved.
    - g. How many passions do you have?
    - h. You may only have one and we need to let that grow in us.
    - i. Nehemiah may have never studies wall building.
    - j. Adding passion to purpose is powerful.
    - k. Let your needs go from concerns to burdens.
    - 1. Sometimes God takes radical steps to get our attention. (Acts 9)
    - m. The Spirit speaks as we worship and fast. (Acts 13:2)
    - n. Other times it might be a quiet process in prayer.
    - o. We begin to think like God. (Romans 12:2)

- p. A man thought of working with the poor but found he didn't fit.
  - 1. Slowly he thought of ways to get into their lives.
  - 2. Now he is passionate about it.
- q. Another man became concerned about adult illiteracy and got involved.
  - 1. He found his purpose and this changed his life.
  - 2. He got others involved in a literacy program.
- 7. Purpose will take us beyond ourselves.
  - a. Why am I here? is the question. God answers this question.
  - b. God instructs us. (Psalm 32:8)
  - c. David died after he had fulfilled God's purpose in his generation. (Acts 13:36)
  - d. We all are on course to fulfill God's purpose but maybe we need to let something go in order to be in God's place.
  - e David was called a man after God's own heart; this kind of person God will use.
  - f. We need to be ready to do anything God wants of us.
  - g. God looks for those whose hearts are right before him.
- 8. Pursue God's purpose.
  - a. The speaker shows a clip from Indians Jones that reveals what we need to have purpose.
    - 1. Faith
    - 2. Humility.
    - 3. Persistence.
    - 4. Passion.
    - 5. Repentance.
    - 6. Knowledge of God's word.
