  - 2. We are not to seek revenge. (Matthew 5:38)

- 3. Give more than is expected of us
- 4. We are to love our enemies. (Matthew 5:43)
  - a. Billy Graham spoke graciously for Bill Clinton when he sinned.
  - b. I was rebuked.
- 5. Our righteousness should be done in secret. (Matthew 6:4)
- 6. We are not to store up treasures on earth.
- 7. We are not to worry.
- 8. We are to seek first the kingdom.
- 9. We are not to lord it over others. (Matthew 20)
  - a. Servant leadership can be selfish.
  - b. We need to serve others unselfishness.
  - c. At Amsterdam 83 I was a speaker but had to serve by setting up chairs.
  - d. At first I resented it but realized I needed to do this for the Lord.
  - e. Our attitudes need to be transformed.
- B. How do we live paradoxically?
  - 1. Live like Jesus.
  - 2. Obey the word of God.
    - a. Be in the word.
    - b. It calls us to a new level of living.
  - 3. Love others particularly when they are unlovable.
    - a. Mother Teresa is a hero of mine.
    - b. I visited the House of the Dying and was impressed by the love the people received.
      - c. God will bring people to us that are unlovable.
      - d. This provides opportunity to appropriate the life of Christ.
  - 4. Forgive others even when they don't deserve it.

a. Jesus forgave those who crucified him. (Luke 23:34)

b. Most people that hurt us have no idea of what they do.
