Victory Over Sin John Crawford

I. Introduction.

A. There is a war going on that is Satan against God. (Matthew 12:29)

B. The events of Job happened so that the riches of God's grace could be explained. (Ephesians 2:7)

C. Christ is the only one who can defeat Satan.

II. Gaining victory over Satan.

A. You must first be a Christian understanding the gospel. (1 Corinthians 15:1-4)

1. It is the death of Jesus for the penalty of sin. (Ephesians 1:7, 1 Peter 1:8)

2. It is the resurrection of Jesus for salvation from the power of sin. (Romans 5:10, 2 Corinthians 1:10, 2 Corinthians 10:11)

a. Jesus had to rise in order to send the Spirit.

b. The Christian has the Holy Spirit in him, which is his victory in the world. (1 John 4:4-5)

c. Jesus is the only one who can defeat the Devil - Jesus and me defeats the Devil in the world.

d. We follow Jesus because He is God. (Matthew 28:19-20)

e. God promises to give us a new spirit to walk in victory, which empowers us to not walk in sin. (Ezekiel 26:36)

f. There are signs to forewarn a fall. (Deuteronomy 17:17)

1) There is a cause and effect in life.

2) We need to heed the Word to avoid the fall. (Psalm 119:111)

3. It is the return of Jesus for freedom from the presence of sin. (1 Peter 1:5, Philippians 3:20-21, 1 Thessalonians 5:8)

B. What is God doing that might cause us to lose the victory? Nothing. (Colossians 3:23)

C. What are we doing that causes us to lose the victory? (John 16:33, 14:21)

1. Are you living in any known sin?

2. Are you living in ignorance? (1 John 3:20, Romans 14:22)

3. It is easier to live a cleaned life than constantly clean one up. (1 John 1:9)
